The Military Chaplains

I was able to identify 20 Church of England and Church of Scotland Military Chaplains who served at Québec (city), Montréal, Trois-Rivières, Sorel, Chambly, and surrounding villages from 1759 to 1768. Except for Rev. Alexander Macpherson (1759-1765), Rev. John Brooke (1760-1768), Rev. John Ogilvie (1760-1764), Rev. John Henry (1765-1784), all other Church of England and Church of Scotland Military Chaplains stayed in Quebec and Montreal only for limited time periods. Most of the British Regiments returned to their home bases in the American Colonies or in the British Isles after the French colony of New France (Nouvelle-France) had been secured from 1760 onward.

A second dossier; Montreal 1760-1764 Baptisms and Marriages blessed and recorded by Rev. John Ogilvie on the pages of Genealogy Ensemble offers the readers a limited view on who were the English-language Protestant families of the 1760–1764-time frame at Montréal, Québec (city), Trois-Rivières and surrounding hamlets and villages.

Regarding the acts of baptisms and marriages of the British and Scottish Military Chaplains of the Quebec City region from 1759 to 1767 as most seasoned family lineage researchers will attest, said acts of baptisms and marriages blessed and recorded by practically all the 20 Military Chaplains are still missing in 2022 except for those of Rev. John Ogilvie.

Archivists with the Anglican Church of Canada in partnership with their counterparts at the Anglican Church of England are in 2022 conducting searches among the dossiers stored at the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts at Lambeth Palace Library in addition to the Anglican Archives at same Lambeth Palace Library in London, England.

As a family lineage researcher and compiler of many years, I am of the opinion, that said missing church registers of acts of baptisms and marriages blessed and recorded in the Quebec City region by some of the 19 Church of England and Church of Scotland Chaplains from 1759 to 1768 were secured by Rev. John

Brooke, who was the Military Chaplain of the 22nd Foot Regiment and of the 60th Foot Royal American Regiment, and said missing church registers were taken by John Brooke to England in 1768 and most likely can be found at the above repositories at Lambeth Palace Library or at regional archives or libraries in the Colney, Norfolk region of England. The latter region being where Rev. John Brooke was buried in 1789.
