The baptisms of Rev. John Ogilvie in Montreal

Please note: The small book of baptisms blessed and recorded by Rev. John Ogilvie from 1760 to 1764 within the Greater Montreal region, including the towns of Sorel, Chambly, St. John's (St-Jean-sur-Richelieu), Varennes, Terrebonne, and other small communities of the Montreal region during a portion of the British Military Period and said book of baptisms was kept for many years at Trinity Church in Manhattan. From 1764 until his retirement, Chaplain John Ogilvie was

assigned to the above prestigious Church of England in New York City at Wall Street. The index of baptisms reproduced below are copies of the original book recorded by John Ogilvie in Montreal. To my knowledge, said original small book of baptisms recorded by John Ogilvie from 1760 to 1764 is kept in 2022, in the vaults of Trinity Church at 75 Broadway, Manhattan, New York.

In 1925, **Mr. G. H. W. Birch** of Montreal West with the help of his brother who resided in New York City were able to trace the missing small register of acts of baptism of Rev. John Ogilvie, British Military Chaplain with the 60th Royal American Regiment and the 62nd Wilshire Regiment – A copy was turned over to G.H.W. Birch of the original book of 150 baptisms of the 1760-1764 period blessed and recorded by Rev. John Ogilvie.

Subsequently, G. H. W. Birch would turn over said copy of this small book of baptisms recorded by John Ogilvie to the Judicial Archives of Montréal after 1925.

Many years later, BANQ Numérique (Bibliothèque et Archives nationales du Québec Digital division) would add the 1760-1764 portion of John Ogilvie to the online dossiers of Garrison Anglican Church of Montreal of 1814 to 1869.

John Ogilvie served from 1760 to 1764 at:

Montréal, Boucherville, Chambly, Lachine, La Prairie, L'Assomption, Laval, Sorel, St. John's (St-Jean-sur-Richelieu) Terrebonne, Varennes, Verchères and it appears that John Ogilvie also visited Québec (city) and Trois-Rivières, perhaps in 1761 for very short periods of time.

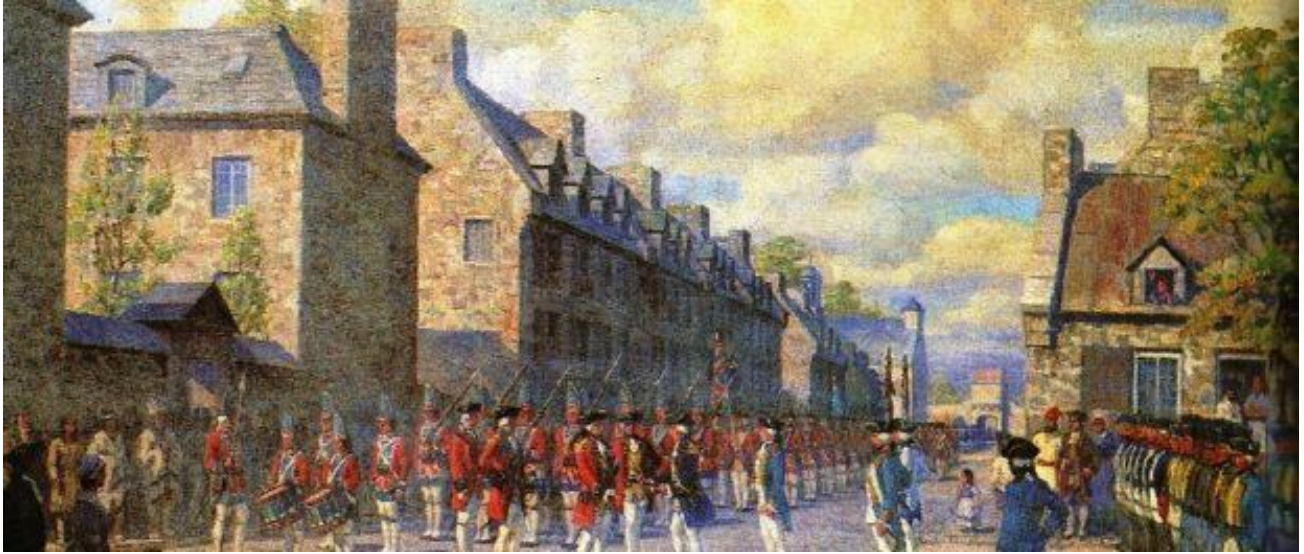

1760-1764

Margaret Anderson – Location unknown, most likely, Montreal and perhaps at Quebec City – March 7, 1761 – Baptism, daughter of William & Elizabeth Anderson, mother's maiden name Elizabeth Clark

George Arnold – Montreal, January 10th, 1762 - Baptism, son of Thomas & Elizabeth Arnold, mother's maiden name Elizabeth Dyer

Michael Arnoldi – Montreal, June 23, 1763 – Baptism of Michael, son of Peter & Philipina Maria Arnoldi, mother's maiden name, Philipina Maria Horn

James Backer – Montreal, June 23, 1763 – Baptism of James, son of William & Jane Backer, mother's maiden name, Jane Crawford

Mary Bamford – Location unknown, most likely at Montreal, February 19 to February 24, 1761 - Baptism, daughter of William & Jane Bamford, mother's maiden name Jane Messenger

John Barber – Montreal, August 8, 1764 - Baptism of John, son of Edward & Ann Barber, mother's maiden name, Ann McGee

Margaret Barrow – Location unknown, most likely at Montreal, June 26, 1762 – Baptism of Margaret, daughter of Thomas & Mary Barrow, mother's maiden name, Mary Downer

Benjamin (Negro slave) – Montreal, May 11, 1762 – Baptism of Benjamin, a negro slave belonging to the Honorable Thomas Gage, Governor of Montreal

Samuel Biven – Côte Saint Antoine Parish (Montreal), February 15, 1761 – Baptism of son of John and Mary Biven. Mother's maiden name Mary Powel

Jacob Blake – Location unknown, most likely at Montreal, September, 1 or 2 or 3 or 4, 1762 (precise date unknown) - Baptism of Jacob, son of Jacob & Catherine Blake, mother's maiden name, Catherine Smith

Ann Boyle – Montreal, November 27, 1763 - Baptism of Ann, daughter of Michael & Mary Boyle, mother's maiden name Mary Kearny (Carney)

Jeremiah Boyle – Montreal, July 28, 1761 – Baptism, son of Michael & Mary Boyle, mother's maiden name Mary Carney (Kearny)

Catherine Boyle(s) – Montreal, August 2, 1761 – Baptism, daughter of Charles & Catherine Boyles, mother's maiden name, Catherine McDonaghay

John Boyle(s) – Montreal, 1760s, content of baptism, unknown – Most likely, the son of Charles & Catherine Boyles or Boyle.

Elizabeth Brachan – Montreal, July 17, 1764 – Baptism of twins, Elizabeth & Hugh, children of Archibald & Elizabeth Brachan, mother's maiden name, Elizabeth Gray

Hugh Brachan – Montreal, July 17, 1764 – Baptism of twins, Elisabeth & Hugh, children of Archibald & Elizabeth Brachan, mother's maiden name, Elizabeth Gray

Daniel Brotherton – Montreal, June 9, 1761 – Baptism, son of William & Ann Brotherton, mother's maiden name Ann Dundass.

Catherine Brown – Montreal, May 18, 1764 – Baptism of Catherine, illegitimate daughter of Lieutenant Brown and Catherine Bayick

John Burroughs – Montreal, November 17, 1761 – Baptism, son of Thomas & Mary Burroughs, mother's maiden name Mary Dunghliness.

Mary Burton – Trois-Rivières or Montreal – December 31, 1763 – Baptism of Mary, daughter Brigadier Ralph Burton, Governor of Trois-Rivières and Margaret Burton, mother's maiden name, Margaret Lydius

Mary Ann Campbell - La Prairie or Montreal, February 22, 1764 – Baptism of Mary Ann, daughter of Captain John & Mary Campbell, mother's maiden name, Marie-Anne Lecorne

Ann Carr – Verchères, November 23, 1760 - Baptism of Ann, daughter of John & Sarah Carr, mother's maiden name Sarah Moore

James Carr – Verchères, March 23, 1761 – Baptism of James, son of James & Jane Carr, mother's maiden name Jane Tinsley

James (Carr) – Montreal, December 2, 1763 – Baptism of James, son of James & Martha _____ (not indicated), mother's maiden name, Martha Carr

Rosa Carrick – Montreal, January 9, 1764 – Baptism of Rosa, daughter of William and Susannah Carrick, mother's maiden name, Susannah Patterson

James Case – Montreal, March 23, 1761 -Baptism of James, son of James & Jane Case, mother's maiden name, Jane Tinsley

Sarah Case - Montreal, May 15, 1763 – Baptism of Sarah, daughter of James & Jane Case, mother's maiden name, Jane Tinsley

Elizabeth Charlton – Laval (Île-Jésus), June 29, 1763 - Baptism of Elizabeth, daughter of John & Elizabeth Charlton, mother's maiden name, Elizabeth Randals.

Mary Chell – Montreal, May 27, 1764 – Baptism of Mary, daughter of Thomas & Elizabeth Chell, mother's maiden name, Elizabeth Parker

Catherine Dobie – Montreal, April 5, 1762 – Baptism of Catherine, illegitimate daughter of Richard Dobie

James Dogget – Montreal, August 16, 1762 -Baptism of James, son of James & Margaret Dogget, mother's maiden name, Margaret Jackson

Elizabeth Donley – Terrebonne, February 24, 1761 - Baptism of daughter of Henry & Mary Donley, mother's maiden name Mary Sheridan

Elizabeth - Location unknown, most likely Montreal, date unknown in 1762 - Negro slave belonging to Mr. James Finley

Robert Evens – St. John's (St-Jean-sur-Richelieu), September 25, 1762 – Baptisms of twins Elizabeth & Robert, children of Henry & Elizabeth Evens, mother's maiden name, Elizabeth Rammage

Eleanor Ferris – Montreal, July 8, 1764 – Baptism of Eleanor, daughter of Hughes & Margaret Ferris, mother's maiden name, Margaret Taylor

Christiane Finlay – Montreal, April 15, 1763 – Baptism of Christiane, daughter of James & Christiane Finlay, mother's maiden name, Christiane Goll

Charles Fishback - Montreal, March 6, 1762 – Baptism, son of Charles & Maria Juliana Fishback, mother's maiden name Maria Juliana Houserin

Mary Ford – Montreal, May 27, 1764 – Baptism of Mary, daughter of Thomas & Sarah Ford, mother's maiden name Sarah Opps

Anne Fraser – Location unknown, most likely Montreal and perhaps at Quebec City, February 26, 1761 – Baptism of Anne, daughter of William & Catherine Fraser, mother's maiden name Catherine Macintosh

Archibald Fraser – Location unknown, date unknown, parents, most likely. William Fraser and Catherine Macintosh

Henry Gage – Montreal, March 24, 1761 – Baptism of Henry son of the Honorable Thomas Gagne, Governor of Montreal, and Margaret his wife, mother's maiden name Margaret Kimble

Maria Theresa Gage – Montreal, May 3, 1762 – Baptism of Maria Theresa, daughter of the Honorable Thomas Gage, Governor of Montreal, and Margaret his wife, mother's maiden name Margaret Kimble

John Christopher Graff – Terrebonne, May 18, 1761 - Baptism of John Christopher, son of Ludwig & Elizabeth Juliana Grau.

Jacob Frederick Graff – Terrebonne, date not indicated – Baptism of Jacob Frederick, son of Ludwig & Elizabeth Juliana Grau.

John Granby – Lachine, March 26, 1762 – Baptism of John, an orphan taken prisoner by the savages. Rescued by General Thomas Gage. Bound servant of Captain Osborn of the 46th Regiment – He is for the future to pass by the name of James Granby

Mary Green – Montreal, August 1, 1762 - Baptism of Mary, daughter of James & Mary Green, mother's maiden name, Mary Driver

Sarah Hammond – Montreal, December 7, 1761 – Baptism of Sarah, daughter of John & Mary Hammond, mother's maiden name Mary Finly (Finley)

Joseph Harrison – Montreal, August 7, 1763 - Baptism of Joseph, son of Jeremiah & Frances Harrison, mother's maiden name, Frances Whitmore

Jane Hellen – Montreal, January 15, 1764 – Baptism of Jane, daughter of James & Mary Hellen, mother's maiden name, Mary Fowler

Mary Hellen - Montreal – September 17, 1761 – Baptism of Mary, daughter of James & Mary Hellen, mother's maiden name, Mary Fowler

Elizabeth Lewis – Montreal, December, December 30, 1761 – Baptism of Elizabeth, daughter of Robert & Elizabeth Lewis, mother's maiden name Elizabeth Braddock

John Ernest Lippe - Montreal, April 29, 1764 – Baptism of John Ernest, son of Ernest & Frances Lippe, mother's maiden name Frances Fuseaux

Maria Magdalena Loudon – Boucherville, January 23, 1763 – Baptism of Maria Magdalena, daughter of Frederick & Catherine Loudon, mother's maiden name Catherine Clouck

Margaret McFarlane - Montreal, May 7, 1762 – Baptism of daughter of Peter & Eleanor McFarlane, mother's maiden name Eleanor Wilson

John Morrisson – Montreal, February 12, 1761 – Baptism of son of Donald and Margery Morrisson, mother's maiden name; Margery Cahoon.

George Munster – Montreal, July 4, 1763 – Baptism of George, illegitimate son of Herbert Munster & Madam Shabert

James Norrey – Montreal, June 11, 1763 – Baptism of James, son of Alexander & Jane Norray, mother's maiden name, Jane Scott

Jane Norrey - Montreal, March 16, 1762 - Baptism, daughter of Alexander & Jane Norrey, mother's maiden name, Jane Scot

Catherine Ogilvie - Montreal, August 29, 1762 – Baptism of Catherine, daughter of Rev. John Ogilvie & Catherine Susan, his wife, mother's maiden name, Catherine Susan Symes

Elizabeth Ovil – Location unknown, most likely Montreal, February 16, 1761 – Baptism of daughter of Thomas & Catherine Ovil, mother's maiden name, Catherine Gay

Joseph Peake – Montreal, October 24, 1761 – Baptism of Joseph, son of Benjamin & Margaret Peake, mother's maiden name, Margaret Taylor

Elizabeth Pits - Montreal, January 1762- Baptism of daughter of John & Mary Pits, mother's maiden name Mary Braymer

Sarah Porter – Montreal, January 1, 1764 - Baptism of Sarah, daughter of Thomas & Elizabeth Porter, mother's maiden name, Elizabeth Pierce

John Prentice – Montreal, May 10, 1762 – Baptism of son of John & Eleanor Prentice, mother's maiden name, Eleanor Murphy
