Montreal, Quebec City, Trois-Rivières in the Early Days of British Canada



The **Articles of Capitulation of Montreal** were agreed upon between the Governor General of New France, Pierre François de Rigaud, Marquis de Vaudreuil-Cavagnal, and Major-General Jeffery Amherst on behalf of the French and British crowns. They were signed on 8 September 1760 in the British camp before the city of Montreal, during the French and Indian War after a two month campaign which led to the fall of the city.

There were 55 articles, including a large array of demands with regards to the protection of the inhabitants of New France: the French, the Canadians, the Acadians, and the *Sauvages* (Indians). De Vaudreuil demanded that all be granted the rights and privileges of the other British subjects. These consisted of an amnesty of Canadian militiamen who had fought for the French, the free exercise of the Roman Catholic faith, the continuation of the ownership of black and Indian slaves by French Canadians, the continuation of the rights and privileges of the clergy and seigneurs and the guarantee of the rights enjoyed by

the native peoples under the French regime. Most were granted by the British Army except those with reference to the Acadians.

Although the articles were drafted without participation from First Nations, Article 40 of the treaty recognized their sovereignty and autonomy, promising to uphold their right to their lands and religion and avoid punishment for having fought for the French.

Les **Articles de capitulation de Montréal** sont un document qui consacre la reddition de la ville de Montréal au cours de la guerre de Sept Ans. Ils sont négociés entre le Gouverneur-général de la Nouvelle-France, Pierre de Rigaud de Vaudreuil et le major-général Jeffery Amherst au nom des couronnes française et britannique.

La signature du document, qui est rédigé en français, a lieu le 8 septembre 1760 sous la tente du camp britannique devant la ville de Montréal qui accepte de capituler¹. La conséquence immédiate de cette signature est la retraite de l'armée française et l'instauration d'un régime militaire britannique sur le pays, qui se prolonge jusqu'en février 1763, alors que le roi de France cède définitivement au roi de Grande-Bretagne le « Canada avec toutes ses dépendances² » par le traité de Paris de 1763.

Les 55 articles sont presque tous accordés par Amherst, sauf ceux qui font référence aux Acadiens. Les demandes françaises comportaient un large éventail de garantie quant à la protection des habitants de la Nouvelle-France : les Français, les Canadiens français, les Acadiens et les Amérindiens. Vaudreuil demande essentiellement que tous les habitants se voient reconnaître les mêmes droits et privilèges que les autres sujets de la couronne britannique.
